St. Mary's Senior Residence Information

Some parishioners have asked about the requirements for living in the St. Mary's Senior Residence. These are as follows: 1) if you are single, you must be 62 years of age or older and your annual income cannot be more than \$33,000; 2) for a couple, one person must be 62 or older and your annual income cannot be more than \$35,000. It must be kept in mind that these income levels change every year so what is true today may not be in the future. "Income" does not mean total assets. It means what you receive each year, e.g., social security, pension, interest on investments.

Sight and Sound Trip

We are reserving tickets for Saturday, March 28, 2009, to see the Easter show Behold the Lamb at Sight & Sound's Millennium Theater in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. The cost will be \$117.00 (based on 40 persons going) and includes the following: round-trip transportation via deluxe 49-passenger motor coach; leisure time at Kettle Kitchen for light lunch on your own; reserved seating for Behold the Lamb, and family-style dinner at Hershey Farm Restaurant, tax and gratuity included. If we do not have 40 people going, the price will increase. If you want to reserve a place for this trip, a deposit of \$75.00 is required by the Wed., Oct. 15, 2008, and the balance will be due by Dec. 31, 2008. Deposits are non-refundable.
