**My brothers and sisters in Christ,**

In about one month's time, we will be listing the good deeds that the children of our parish will promise to do as their offering to St. Mary's. The adults of our parish support St. Mary's through their offering of treasure each week. We will soon be asking our children to support our parish through their good deeds. We will begin with the children who go to the Children's Liturgy of the Word at 10:00 Mass each Sunday. They will receive an envelope on which they will write a good deed that they did that week. Just as we collect the envelopes of the adults at Mass, so we will collect the children's envelopes.

And just as we publish each week the amount of treasure that was given to the parish the previous week, so we will be listing the good deeds that our children promise to do as a sign of their support for St. Mary's. In this way, we hope that they will see, not only that they are a part of our parish, but also that they can support St. Mary's by what they will do for others.

With the recent concern about the spreading of swine flu, I want to address this issue, which certainly has caused some level of anxiety. First, I would ask everyone to exercise a healthy approach to what is happening. These kinds of concerns often bring with them one of two extremes – panic at one end or complacency at the other.

I would like to strike what I hope is a healthy balance that essentially asks everyone to use an appropriate amount of common sense. **First**, if you feel uncomfortable shaking hands at the sign of peace, you can simply offer others the peace of Christ *verbally*. We hope that every one will understand if that happens. **Second**, if you are not feeling well, do not receive the Blood of Christ from the cup if that is what you usually do. That is something that parishioners should do if they are not feeling well. **Third**, if it is your custom to receive the host on the tongue, we ask that you consider receiving in the hand temporarily. This safeguards the priests and Eucharistic ministers as well as everyone who receives from them.

Finally, if you can support the Tricky Tray at Transfiguration Academy, it will be held this Friday, May 15. Please look at the section of the bulletin that announces events at Transfiguration Academy for the time and the cost of admission. This event helps to support the spiritual and educational activities of our co-sponsored school.

**Campaign Information**

Our Building and Grounds Committee has prioritized the following areas of repair that need to be addressed. We will be making the following repairs: **1) repair of the flat roofs over the sacristies; 2) replacement of steam traps and other repairs in the heating systems of the school; 3) looking into ways in which water from the rain downspouts on the school side of the church can be diverted, stopping the leak in the lower church; 4) repairing the concrete work outside of the rectory office; 5) painting/repairing the ceiling in the church; 6) refinishing/refurbishing the pews in the church.** We know that much of this work is not visible to most people; however, this is the work for which we raised the money and the repairs that are most immediate.
