### Water and Fire

These two symbols are key to what the Easter season is about. Water represents the new life that is ours in the sacrament of Baptism. Fire shines forth as the symbol of Christ, the light of the world. The Easter Candle stands next to the ambo where the word of God is proclaimed each day of the Easter season. The water runs in the baptismal font, not still or stagnant, but flowing and alive. These are symbols that can be used at home, especially on the table around which your family gathers to eat. **Have a candle lit in the middle of the table, symbolizing Christ our Light. Have a bowl on the table with water, taken from our font. Light the candle when your family gathers to eat. Bless yourselves with the water when you pray before your meal. Make Easter alive in your home for the days of the Easter Season.**

**Campaign Prayer**

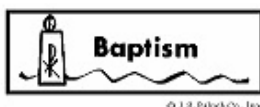
