Broadway Bound



We have only 11 tickets remaining to see the musical comedy Promises, Promises for Friday evening, Sept. 10, 2010, but they are going fast and you need to get yours as soon as possible. The cost is \$99.50 per person and the seats are in the first mezzanine. To reserve a seat, you must come to the rectory as soon as possible. There is also a charge of \$15.00 for the cost of the bus. That will be collected the evening of the show. First-come, first-serve basis only.

The Miracle of Christmas at Sight & Sound

On Saturday, Dec. 18, 2010, we will be going to see The Miracle of Christmas at the Millennium Theater in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. The cost is as follows: \$116.50 for those 19 years and older; \$92.50 for ages 13-18; and \$72.00 for ages 3-12. These prices are based on a minimum of 40 persons on the motor coach. If there are less than 40 persons, the prices would increase and would depend on the number of persons going. The cost includes: 1) round-trip transportation on a motor coach, 2) time at Kettle Kitchen, 3) Amish family-style dinner at the Good 'N Plenty Restaurant, tax and gratuity included, and 4) reserved seating for The Miracle of Christmas. One-half of the cost must be paid at the rectory in order to reserve a place. The balance would be due by Sun., Oct. 31.

Part-time Maintenance Position

St. Mary's is looking for a person to fill a part-time maintenance position at the parish. The primary responsibilities will be 1) the landscaping of the parish grounds: cutting the grass, trimming/edging grass areas, pruning shrubbery, removing weeds, blowing leaves, and 2) painting of both interior and exterior spaces on the property. The position would also include some plumbing, carpentry, and electrical work as needed and the putting up/taking down of chairs/tables in the gymnasium. Martha Welcomed Jesus

(Luke 10: 38-42)

Two ways to love: Today we hear the story of two sisters, Martha and Mary. They might remind us of people in our own families. One person, Martha, seems to do all the work, while another, Mary, doesn't come to help her. Mary just sits and enjoys the company. Martha complains to Jesus, but he only gives the answer that "Mary has chosen the better part." What does that mean? It certainly doesn't mean that there are some people who must do all the work while others do nothing. It means that love is more important than work. In fact, as St. Therese of Avila says, "love turns work into rest." The "better part" chosen by Mary was the love of Jesus. Although she worked very hard, Martha forgot that her work needed to be done with love, and so she felt bitter and sad. Hard work can be a beautiful way of loving, but work without love becomes a burden. Jesus comes to carry our burdens for us. He wants us to love, whether work or at rest. - Magnifikid
